	Second shift public School Students from Academic year 2017-18 who did not re-enroll for academic year 2018-2019 *MEHE has accepted 39,000 (Non- Lebanese) new students in second shift public schools for the academic year 2018-19. 25,000 of these new students are in PREP- ECE *MEHE-PMU reported that APPROXIMATELY 28,500 students who were registered for the academic year 2017-18 did not return this academic year 2018-19. Out of the 28,500, the data of 20,469 children (either unreachable or not willing to continue education or similar unclear reason) was referred to UNICEF and UNHCR for their follow up and verification on the reasons of no enrolment in 2018 2019. * In parallel, during registration phase, MEHE contacted School principals and asked them to call the students who did not return in 2018 -2019 to encourage them to return back to school.		

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	• The Minister's Decision imposed certain rules on the classes that can be open in the morning shift to avoid opening unnecessary sections. For instance, having sections open because of non-Lebanese in the am shift requires the need to hire more teachers, which is an additional cost for MEHE, knowing that such a cost will add up to a burden in the long term especially that MEHE will have commitments to those teachers, whom there will be no source of funding for their salaries, especially if funds are stopped. Therefore, it was critical for all schools to follow the instructions mentioned in the Minister's decision as it is implementing a safe strategy for the longer term, keeping the main mission which is to enrol all children within a solid sustainable registration matrix, and leaving no one outside the schools. This assures that the Rumor that MEHE- PMU is moving NON- LEBANESE children from first shift to second shift is not true. In parallel, it is worth mentioning that a lot of cases were noted especially in Cycle 3 where students were moved from PM shift to AM shift in existing classes to avoid opening sections with few numbers of students in the PM shift.
