

Libya: Activities at Disembarkation, monthly update


UNHCR LIBYA MARCH 2019

Libya continues to be a transit point for departure from North Africa towards Europe. UNHCR's interventions at disembarkation points in Libya focus on the provision of life-saving assistance and protection monitoring, to identify persons in need of international protection, as well as vulnerable individuals, such as unaccompanied and separated children, elderly, medical cases, women at risk or victims of trafficking. UNHCR through its partner International Medical Corps provides medical services and core relief items. In addition, UNHCR rehabilitated WASH facilities at six disembarkation points, in Azzawya, Tripoli (3), Tajoura (Al Hamidiyah) and Alkhums.

As of 31 March 2019, the Libyan Coast Guard rescued/intercepted a total of 996 people in different locations along the Libyan coast. Over the first three months last year, the LCG rescued/intercepted a total of 3,794 refugees and migrants at sea. So far in 2019, Libyan local authorities have recovered 9 bodies of people who perished while attempting to cross the Mediterranean towards Europe, while 143 people were reported missing.

Monthly trends - people rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2018-2019


Form January to March 2019, 996 people were rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard, a decrease of 73.7% compared to the same period in 2018.



Top 10 nationalities rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2019




Monthly trends - recorded loss of life in Libyan waters in 2018-2019

Form January to March 2019, 9 dead bodies were recovered in Libyan waters, compared to 21 over the same period in 2018. In addition, 143 people were reported missing, compared to 229 in the same months in 2018.



People rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2019 by group


Of the total of 996 people rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard, 721 were men, 118 women, 130 children and 27 unidentified.
