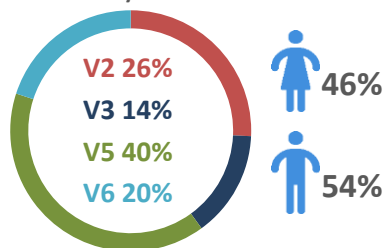

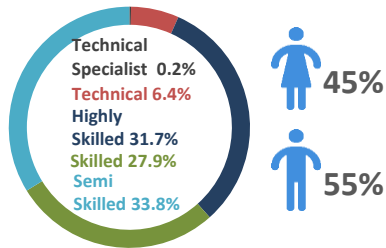

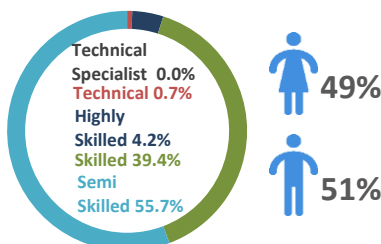

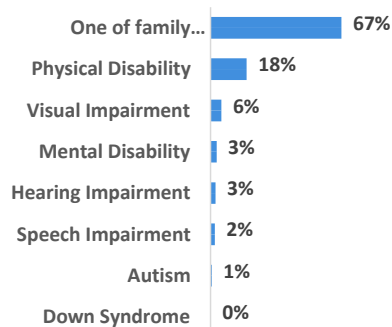

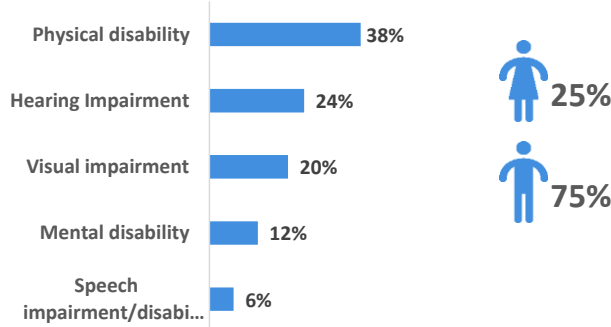

Feedbacks received from the community

- Community members requested UNHCR to rotate the fixed IBVs, especially at Makani centers and school as well as IMC health mobilizers.
