Meeting Minutes

CO Belgium Luxembourg

- TCNs need residence status in Ukraine, no option to safely return to country of origin (short term residents not eligible for protection)
- So far 40k have applied for protection (UA and TCNS)
- Gives right to education, healthcare, basic banking services, social welfare living wage, can rent property, follow an integration course (not mandatory), right to legal assistance
- Working with universities to allow them to resume studies in country of origin, but very early stage
- TCNs can access benefits as soon as they have their residence card A

IOM Germany

- TCNs who were in Ukraine can enter and stay in Germany without visa or registration until 31 August 2022 an exceptional extension
- Only spouses of Ukrainians or recipients of international protection can apply for TP in reality
- TCNs must register in order to have the right to work

Challenges:

Racial profiling
Wrongly advised to seek asylum
Passports seized
Student visa requirements under national law
Financial means and scholarships

Civil society actors and diaspora communities are very vocal about these issues

IOM Portugal



- Portugal received 37950 requests of TP only 2768 are Tcns, mainly from India, Nigeria, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Russia and Belarus, who cannot return to their country of origin and benefit from a long stay visa - in theory should have permanent residence in Ukraine
- Request can be made online but all children under 18 need to be registered in person
- Allows access to health care, national user number, access to labour market and tax authority (automatic), access to education and Portuguese language courses
- Those with no resources have access to housing and social support, but civil society and diaspora communities responses were strong

Challenges:

Lack of monitoring by Portuguese government
